# Safe boating in Morro Bay:

Morro Bay is a beautiful harbor with wide ranging boating challenges. With a notoriously dangerous harbor entrance, narrow channels and many shoals, heavy currents, a sometimes persistent marine layer and fresh winds, the smart boater will prepare for a voyage carefully. Here are some hot tips to make your trip safe and enjoyable.



Harbor Entrance: As one of the roughest on the West Coast, it often has a hazardous bar warning posted with large Northwest swells. Exercise caution regardless of experience. Low tides and swift currents will create a dangerous condition with breaking waves across the entrance. Never transit the harbor entrance with waves breaking in the channel. Contact US Coast Guard at (805) 772-2167 for advisories.

Channels: Pay close attention to the channel markers, indicating deep water from the harbor entrance to as far south as Fairbanks Point (by the State Park Marina). There are numerous shoals in the bay, and grounding on an ebbing tide can leave you high  $\vartheta$  dry for hours. The bay is nearly four miles long, and 60% is exposed mud flats at a zero tide. Stay in the designated channels unless you have local knowledge.

Fog: We get our fair share of fog here, and it can come at any time. Never leave the harbor without knowledge of how to use a compass, charts, electronic aids to navigation, and sound signals. Keep your eyes and ears open.

# Know before you go!

Safety Gear: Always check to ensure your vessel is equipped with all required safety gear, PFDs, anchor & rode, VHF radio, and cell phone. Refer to the ABC's of California Boating Guide for more information: dbw.parks.ca.gov





**Weather:** It sure can change quickly, and you'll want to be prepared for all conditions. Always check the weather forecast and the tides before venturing out on the water.

#### **Harbor Rules:**

- **Speed Limit:** No vessel shall operate in excess of 5mph or produce a wake within the harbor or upon entering between the jetties.
- Anchoring: No person shall anchor, moor or secure a vessel or any object within the city limits except in the designated area between day markers 10 and 12.
- **Sewage:** Discharge of sewage is strictly prohibited. There are three designated sewage pumpout stations for your convenience.
- Liveaboards: A permit is required to live aboard your vessel more than three nights in any seven day period.



#### TEN TIPS FOR CLEAN BOATING



# 1. PLAN AHEAD FOR YOUR HEAD.

Manage sewage properly. Use sewage pumpouts, dump stations, or mobile-pumpout services instead. It is illegal to release untreated sewage within three miles from shore.

#### 2. STOW IT, DON'T THROW IT.

Keep trash on board. Never throw cigarettes, fishing line, or any other garbage into waterways. Take advantage of shore-side facilities to recycle plastic, glass, metal, and paper. Avoid excess packaging.

# 3. REDUCE GREY WATER DISCHARGE.

Use a phosphate-free soap to minimize the impacts of grey water on the marine environment. Whenever possible, minimize discharge by using onshore facilities to wash dishes and shower.

# 4. PROPERLY DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS WASTE.

Dispose of paint, batteries, antifreeze, cleaning products, oil, oil filters, and other hazardous waste at a collection facility. Save time, and pump out waste in the same visit!

# 5. SPILL-PROOF OIL CHANGE & FUELING.


Use a portable oil-change pump, to change oil. To prevent spills, drain used oil into a sealable container. Fill the fuel tank slowly. Leave 10% of the tank empty to allow fuel to expand as it warms. Always have an oil absorbent handy to catch spills from oil changes and fueling. Recycle saturated absorbents, fuel bibs, oil, and oil filters at hazardous waste facilities.

#### CLEAN & MAINTAIN YOUR BOAT THE GREEN WAY.

When possible, perform maintenance tasks with your boat out of the water. Contain waste with tarps and vacuum sanders. Use cleaners that are water-based, biodegradable, phosphate-free, and labeled as less toxic. Use non-copper, antifouling coatings for your boat. Minimize fouling growth and extend the life of the hull coating by thoroughly wiping the boat bottom with a soft, non-abrasive sponge.

Do not spread aquatic invasive plants and animals. Before leaving the water, examine your boat and equipment. Remove any visible mud, plants, or animals. Never release plants or animals into a body of water unless they originated n that body of water. Do not release plants or animals into storm drains; most storm drains lead to water bodies or wetlands. Clean and dry anything that came in contact with the water (boats, trailers, equipment, dogs, boots, clothes, etc.).

# 8. PREVENT OILY BILGE DISCHARGE.

To prevent fuel and oil leaks, keep the bilge clean and dry, and your boat engine well-tuned. Put oil absorbents beneath the engine and in the bilge. Check them often and dispose of them at a hazardous waste collection center.


# 9. DO NOT ADD SOAP TO DISPERSE SPILLS.


Never use soap to disperse fuel or oil spills. This is harmful to the environment and illegal. Instead, use your spill kit and call the Harbor Department for help. Avoid using bilge cleaners as they may be inadvertently discharged overboard.

# 10. PUT FISH WASTE IN THE TRASH, NOT THE WATER.

Whenever possible, use a fish-cleaning station and put all fish waste in the closed dumpster provided. If you need to clean fish onboard your boat, collect and bring all waste to a closed dumpster. Dumping fish carcasses into the water is against Morro Bay City code and can result in fines. Fish carcasses can get stuck in birds' throats, causing injury or death.



# Watch out for wildlife

like seals, sea lions, sea otters, birds, whales, & dolphins Tips to avoid disturbance or collision:



- · Look out for surfacing animals.
- Travel at safe speeds and respect "no wake" zones.
- Avoid chasing or encircling animals.
  - · Keep observation time short (30 minutes or less)
  - Allow 5 boat lengths between you and wildlife.
  - · Respect the nap! Leave sleeping animals alone.
